Dick will be interred at Arlington National Cemetery at a date to be determined.

Project Lifesaver is the premier search and rescue program operated internationally by public safety agencies, and is strategically designed for "at risk" individuals who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering. The primary mission of *Project Lifesaver* is to provide timely response to save lives and reduce potential injury for adults and children with the propensity to wander due to a cognitive condition.

All are welcome!

Members of *Project Lifesaver* will wear a personalized bracelet that emits a constant locating signal. Each transmitter has a unique radio frequency enabling specially trained Deputies to positively locate and identify a missing individual. The Stafford County Sheriff's Office works with other local and national law enforcement agencies to provide citizens with this high-tech tool in an effort to save lives and bring peace of mind to loved ones and caretakers. *Scan QR code for an informational video*.
